NARRATIVE

On February 6, 2010 at approximately 0308 hours, I was traveling west on Baldwin Street when I observed several males that appeared to be possibly trying to enter the south east door to Journalism from the plaza level. I noticed the individuals near the stairwell and then noticed them run towards the door and out of sight. At that time I exited my patrol vehicle and began walking across the plaza. Lieutenant Huff took the vehicle and circled around to Hooper Street.

As I crossed the plaza, I began to hear loud yelling and what sounded like a fight. As I came around the corner, I saw two males on the ground fighting with one another and a third male standing over them. The two males that were fighting were later identified as Wilkinson and Tillis. Both individuals appeared to be trying to gain position and were actively grabbing at and fighting with one another. Neither individual ever appeared to take any defensive actions.

Upon my approach, I identified myself as a police officer and was in uniform. I ordered both individuals to quit fighting and to release one another. Neither individual made any attempts to distance himself from the other and were still actively fighting. As I began to pull out my peppers spray, I noticed that Wilkinson was gouging at Tillis's eyes with his fingers. Due to both individual's lack of compliance to verbal commands and Wilkinson's attempts to do serious harm to Tillis, I sprayed Wilkinson in the face with a two second burst of OC pepper spray. I then gave additional verbal commands to both individuals. I then heard Wilkinson continue to taunt Tillis and observed that he was still failing to comply with verbal commands and subsequently sprayed him in the face with an additional two second burst of OC pepper spray. A small amount of the OC pepper spray inadvertently got on Tillis whose head was next to Wilkinson.

Still, Wilkinson failed to comply with verbal commands and continued to fight. Wilkinson, who was on top of Tillis was the focus of my immediate attention since he was on top and appeared to be making the greatest efforts to cause bodily harm. I then secured my pepper spray and grabbed Wilkinson and made several attempts to physically pull him off of Tillis. After several attempts, I was able to get Wilkinson off. Wilkinson then grabbed me by the legs and started to try and fight me. I yelled at Wilkinson to stop and after a couple of seconds he did and verbally acknowledged that he was giving up. I then gave Wilkinson additional verbal commands to prone out and to place his hands behind his back which he complied with.

As I took Wilkinson in custody, Lieutenant Huff came up from the Hooper Street side of Journalism. Lieutenant Huff and I both gave verbal commands to Tillis to sit down, which he eventually complied with. Lieutenant Huff then tried to make contact with third individual who had been watching the fight, Stanhope. I observed as Stanhope clearly viewed Lieutenant Huff and made eye contact as he began backing away. Lieutenant Huff told Stanhope to return and not to flee. Stanhope then began running away towards Baldwin Street as Lieutenant Huff advised over the radio that he was in a foot chase. A short time later, I heard Lieutenant Huff advise that he had the subject detained. I advised all other units to slow their response and requested EMS to be en route to decontaminate Wilkinson. Corporal Thompson retrieved a jug of water from my patrol vehicle to aid in decontaminating Wilkinson and Tillis. Once all three subjects were returned to the scene, Tillis began to repeatedly state that Stanhope had not been involved in the altercation. Officer Firkin spoke with Stanhope and smelled an odor commonly associated with alcoholic beverages coming from Stanhope. Stanhope then admitted to Officer Firkin that he had consumed three beers and was determined to be 18 years of age.

Wilkinson was searched incident to arrest and the first identification I saw in his wallet was a Georgia driver's license displayed in a clear display bearing the name, Daniel Christopher Oshea. The license indicated a date of birth that would have made the individual over the age of twenty one. I ran the license over GCIC thinking that it was Wilkinson and it returned valid. I then tried to ask "Daniel" a question. When he did not respond, I looked closer and realized that the picture on the license did not match Wilkinson. I then read Wilkinson his Miranda warning which he stated that he understood. I then asked Wilkinson where his real identification was and he explained where in his wallet it was located. I retrieved his actual identification from a compartment that kept it out of view. Wilkinson subsequently admitted that he had used the alternate identification to enter bars and consume alcohol that night. I smelled an odor commonly associated with alcoholic beverages coming from Wilkinson's person.

I then also asked Wilkinson about the fight. Wilkinson, who was now being very cooperative, stated that he had referred to Tillis, who was in Pi Kappa Alpha, as a "Pi Kappa Asshole". Wilkinson stated that he and Tillis then began to exchange words and that Tillis pushed him first and that

he then retaliated by pushing Tillis.

Lieutenant Huff had obtained a fraudulent Texas driver's license from Tillis. Tillis, who was under arrest, was read his Miranda rights which he stated that he understood. Tillis had an odor commonly associated with alcoholic beverages coming from his person and admitted to having consumed large amounts of alcohol beyond what he typically consumes. I then asked Tillis what he had the Texas license for and he replied, "It's a lie." I asked him that meant that the identification was fraudulent and he stated that it was and subsequently admitted that he had used it to get in bars and purchase alcohol. While, speaking with Tillis he began to vomit. I asked Tillis what started the fight between Wilkinson and himself and Tillis responded that he did not remember being in a fight.

Upon the arrival of EMS, both Tillis and Wilkinson were looked at and cleared for transport.

Stanhope was transported to the Clarke County Jail by Officer Firkin and charged with underage possession of alcohol and issued citation number 020507. I transported Tillis and Wilkinson to the Clarke County Jail where they were both charged with underage possession of alcohol, possession of fraudulent identification, and affray. All personal property of all three subjects was released to the Jail.

The fraudulent identification obtained from Tillis and the one obtained from Wilkinson were placed in evidence. An attempt to obtain warrants was attempted via the electronic warrant system, however the system repeatedly crashed. Warrants will be obtained a later date.
